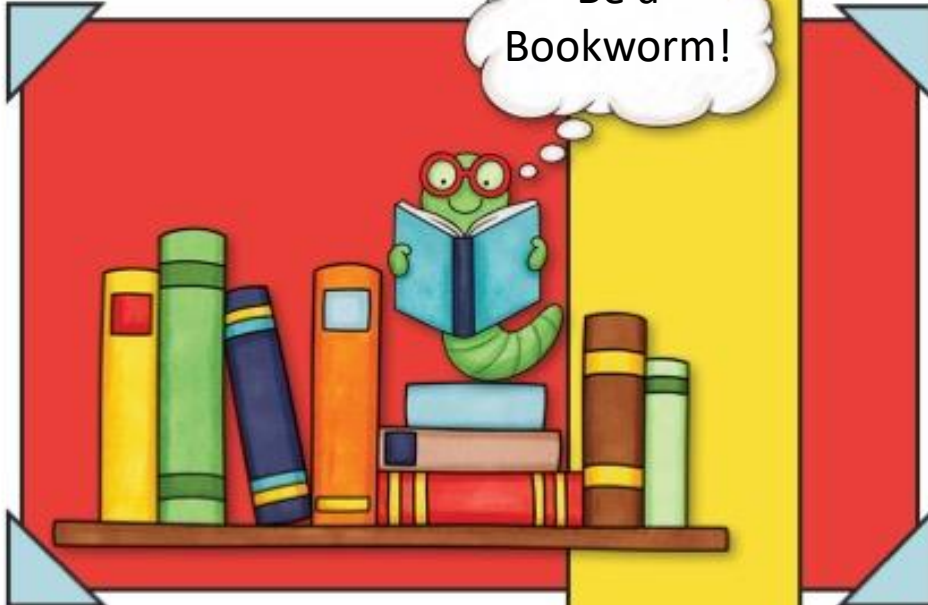

Cara and Lucy's posters have been chosen to go forward to the All-Ireland Competition. Well done!

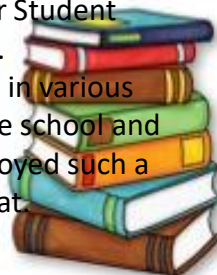
Student Council

After a few trials in the park the following teams were chosen.

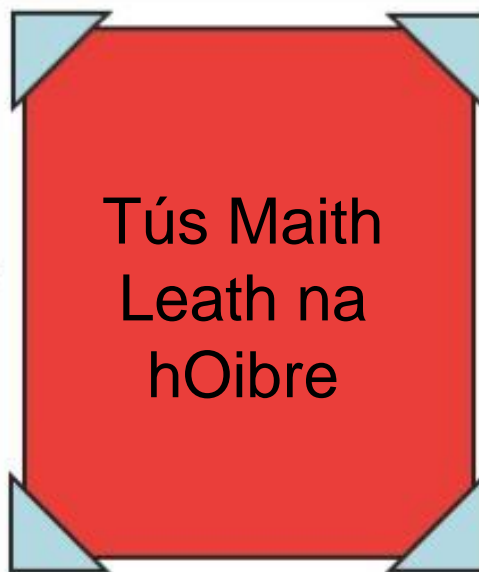
